College of Southern Nevada to host mental health conference on April 14

February 8, 2023 — The College of Southern Nevada will host the **Mental Health 360 Conference: Knowledge, Self-Care & Transformation** April 14 on its North Las Vegas Campus. The free, daylong event is open to the community at large.

The conference will bring together leading mental health scholars, clinicians, advocates and students to raise awareness about mental health warning signs and share advice that supports treatment options for people living with mental health afflictions.

Psychologist <u>Dr. Sheldon Jacobs</u> will be the keynote speaker. Jacobs is an author, a licensed marriage and family therapist, and a regional media consultant on mental health topics. He is also the vice president for the National Alliance on Mental Illness—Southern Nevada and is a member of NAMI's national board of directors.

The conference will feature three hourlong workshops, each consisting of five tracks:

Crisis & Trauma: Get prepared to identify, resolve and share resources for long-term support to avoid remaining in a crisis state.

Student Needs: Discussion of students' transition from a highly structured high school environment to an independent college environment, where they experience a variety of emotions.

Legal Concerns: Presenters will share how the state of college students' mental health may give rise to a wide range of legal issues.
